




















Reasons You Should Understand Humanizing Your Crime Stories:



Identify Core Motivations

Vulnerabilities are the weaknesses, fears, and emotional wounds that make characters human and relatable.

- Understand Psychological Drives: Know the basic human fears and emotional wounds and how they affect behavior.
- Identify Specific Triggers: Pinpoint events or circumstances in the character's life that could trigger these vulnerabilities.

Example Redemption Subplot




Identify Moral Complexities

Integrating moral complexities into your characters adds depth and realism to your story, highlighting the internal struggles they face.

- Understand Ethical Conflicts: Know the common ethical dilemmas and how they impact decision-making.
- Identify Specific Scenarios: Pinpoint situations in the character's life that could trigger these moral complexities.





Identify Hidden Motivations

Uncovering hidden motivations reveals the deeper reasons behind a character's actions, adding layers of intrigue and depth to your story.


- Understand Psychological Drives: Know the basic hidden motivations and how they shape behavior.
- Identify Specific Triggers: Pinpoint events or circumstances in the character's life that could trigger these hidden motivations.









Write a Vulnerability Profile

Create a detailed profile that lists your character's vulnerabilities, the reasons behind them, and how they affect their actions in the story.

Write a Moral Complexity Profile

Create a detailed profile that lists your character's moral conflicts, the reasons behind them, and how they affect their actions and decisions in the story.

Write a Hidden Motivation Profile

Create a detailed profile that lists your character's hidden motivations, the reasons behind them, and how they affect their actions in the story.



Consider how you can integrate more than one subplot to create a richer, more compelling narrative. Weave your main characters together through their vulnerabilities, moral complexities, and hidden motivations to add layers of depth to your crime story.

- How can your characters' personal journeys intersect and influence each other?
- What conflicts arise from the interplay of love, redemption, and mentorship subplots?
- How can you enhance the emotional stakes by weaving multiple subplots together?
